




# Registering YubiKey with OME-RESA




1) You should receive an email from Duo Security (no-reply@duosecurity.com) similar to the one shown.



2) Click on the link



## You will be taken to the OME-RESA page to register your YubiKey


Two-factor authentication enhances the security of your account by using a secondary device to verify your identity. This prevents anyone but you from accessing your account, even if they know your password.

This process will help you set up your account with this added layer of security.




Select your device to add (Security Key), Insert your YubiKey into the computers USB port (copper circle facing up or towards you) and then “continue”

You should get a pop window opening on your computer screen that asks you to touch the button on your YubiKey – touch your finger to the blinking copper circle for at least 1 second. Then continue.



NOTE: You may be asked to enter your security key PIN first. If this happens, simply touch the circle on the YubiKey and release. The field will auto populate. The green “Y” on the YubiKey should start to blink at which time you will be instructed to touch the circle again.



You can access settings to the security setting by using your OME-RESA login credentials. (Same login as you use for ProgressBook)





This tutorial has shown you how to register your YubiKey with OME-RESA. This must be done before you can use the YubiKey for Gmail or other accounts that require Multi Factor Authentication. Additional enrollment is required for each account you wish to use your security key for.
